Friday Night at the Movies will present, South Pacific (1958). (157 minutes)

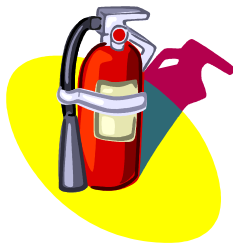
Thursday 11 @ 1:00 pm in the Ballroom
